This Deed, Made this 14<sup>th</sup> day of June in the year of our Lord,

one thousand eight hundred and eighty seven between

The Grand Junction Town Company, Improvements

of the County of Mesa and State of Colorado, of the first part, and Mamie Stewart

of the County of Mesa and State of Colorado, of the second part:

Witnesseth, That the said party of the first part, for and in consideration of the sum of One Hundred and fifty DOLLARS,

to the said party of the first part, in hand paid by the said party of the second part, the receipt whereof is hereby confessed and acknowledged, has granted, bargained, sold and conveyed, and by these presents, does grant, bargain, sell, convey and confirm unto the said party of the second part, his heirs and assigns forever, all the following described lots or parcels of land, situate, lying and being in the County of Mesa, and State of Colorado, to wit: Lots numbered Six (6) Seven (7) and Eight (8) in Block numbered 111.

in the Town of Grand Junction, as shown by the Grand Junction Town Company's Original Plat of said Town, on file in the office of the Recorder of the County of Gunnison and State of Colorado and copied June 16<sup>th</sup> 1887 into the Records of the County of Mesa, also Lot No 25 in Plat 1, Division A, in Maple Cemetery in the N.E. 1/4 of the S.E. 1/4 of Sec. 10, T. 1, S. R. 11 W. of the 10th Meridian in consideration of ten dollars same to be expended in improvements of cemetery.

TOGETHER with all and singular the hereditaments and appurtenances thereto belonging or in anywise appertaining, and the reversion and reversions, remainder and remainders rents, issues and profits thereof; and all the estate, right, title, interest, claim and demand whatsoever of the said party of the first part, either in law or equity, of, in and to the above bargained premises, with the hereditaments and appurtenances TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said premises above bargained and described, with the appurtenances, unto the said party of the second part his heirs and assigns forever. And the said THE GRAND JUNCTION TOWN COMPANY, party of the first part, for itself, its successors and assigns, does covenant, grant, bargain and agree, to and with the said party of the second part, his heirs and assigns, that at the time of the enacting and delivery of these presents it was well seized of the premises above conveyed, as of good, sure, perfect, absolute and indefeasible estate of inheritance, in law, in fee simple, and has good right, full power and lawful authority to grant, bargain, sell and convey the same, in manner and form aforesaid, and that the same are free and clear from all former and other grants, bargains, sales, assessments and incumbrances of whatever kind or nature soever, except liens and taxes which may have accrued since the 27<sup>th</sup> day of September A. D. 1886; and the above bargained premises, in the quiet and peaceable possession of the said party of the second part, his heirs and assigns, against all and every person or persons lawfully claiming or to claim the whole or any part thereof, the said party of the first part shall and will WARRANT AND FOREVER DEFEND.
