

Obituary.

DIED—At Grand Junction Aug. 26th, 1887, Ariel Biglow, aged 43 years, from the effects of a kick over the heart by a horse.

Our citizens were astounded on Wednesday morning by the announcement of the death of Mr. Biglow, and many were the exclamations of sorrow that fell from the lips of all. The feeling of sorrow was intensified the more when they learned the cause of his death. He had gone to the stable as was his custom, to feed and care for his horses preparatory to starting out with the warer wagon. When next seen he was lying just outside the stable door, and when called to did not respond; a gentle shake on the shoulder, and then it was discovered that he was dead. Dr. Ingersoll was notified and the usual efforts were made to start circulation and resuscitation, but in vain; he was then carried to his home and an examination recorded the fact that he had been kicked or struck immediately over the heart; and latter on the bruise revealed the print of the cork on the horse shoe in the flesh. His death must have been instantaneous and he could hardly have realized the cause.

Ariel Biglow was born at Fowlerville, Mich., Aug. 14th, 1884. He had lived in Colorado since 1879, and in Grand Junction since the fall of 1882. He was married Feb. 19th, 1878, to the eldest daughter of Mr. J. T. Sharp, of this city, who survives him with two children. Always quite and attentive to his business, he had won the the esteem and confidence of all who knew him, and we believe it can be truthfully said that he had not an enemy. The funeral was held from the M. E. church South, Friday afternoon at two o'clock, and his body was interred at Mr Hall's Fairview Cemetery. A large line of carriages followed his body to the grave.
