Our citizens were called upon today to pay their last respects to all that is mortal of our honored citizen, George A. Crawford. All differences were forgotten and friend and foe alike remembered that he was the founder of Grand Junction and that to his mergies we are indebted for the location of this bright and beautiful young city. In intellect he was the peer if not the super-ior of any man in western Colorado, but physically, weak. He was possessed of a strong character which marked out his course through life. We remembered, too, that he was the recipient of many honors at the hands of his fellow men, in his former home, Kansas, and also from the high-est authorities in the United States prior to his residence here. His disposition was al-ways cheerful and his polite and gentlemanly bearing made him many friends whose searts are sad today. We shall miss his fumiliar figure from our streets and his counsel in matters of public interest. It was the regret of his dying days that he could not live to see the full realisation of his hopes for GrandfJunction. But be-fore his death he had the satisfaction of seeing the place take such a start that it gave promise of all he had prophesied. He is gone, and for the good that he has one in life and as a founder and builder owns and cities, especially our own be-delty of Grand Junction, he will live the memory of our people. And, as the rs roll by and new people come in to the their homes with us, we will point to hem his grave on yonder hill, and say 'Here lies thefounder of Grand Junction.',
