PROBABLE SUICIDE.

Man Dies at Star Lodging House.

Morphine on His Person--Nothing to Identify.

A man between forty-five and fifty years of age came to the Star loding house last night and asked for lodging, paying the proprietor twenty-five cents for his bed.

During the night, so says the proprietor, the man breathed very heavily and was evidently in pain. This morning he continued to breathe heavily and the proprietor, William Grady, called in the services of a physician. Before Dr. Capps could arrive there the man was dead.

Not a scrap of paper of any kind was found on his body to identify him. There was found on him a box of morphine nils and a small bothly of pressioned.

Quite a number of people think the man must have taken an overdose of morphine or taken it with premeditated decire to kill himself.

Coroner, Dr. L. F. Ingersoll, ordered the body taken to the undertaking establishment of A. L. Gourley. Dr. Ingersoll believes the man died from natural causes and will order the body buried tomorrow.
