

**PIONEER GONE TO REST.
L. N. FARMER IS DEAD.**

L. N. Farmer one of the oldest and best known residents of the Kannah Creek country, died last night at his home near the Pride school house, after a long illness. He suffered from a nervous attack and heart trouble. For many months he has been in bad health and for the past few weeks his condition has been such that no hope was held out for his recovery.

The deceased has been a resident of the county for many years and was widely known in Grand Junction. He was a pioneer resident of western Colorado. He was about 70 years of age and is survived by several children all of whom are grown. His wife died a number of years ago.

Mr. Farmer was a veteran of the civil war and at the time of his death was a member of the local post of the Grand Army of the Republic.

He has owned and operated a ranch in the Kannah Creek country for a long period and was one of the leading ranchmen of that section of the county. He was a man of noble character, gentle in spirit and affable in manners. He was held in the highest respect and many there are who will learn of his death with sincere sorrow.

Undertaker Gourley was summoned to the Farmer home this morning to prepare the remains for burial.

The funeral will take place tomorrow noon from the Pride school house. The interment will take place at the Whitewater cemetery about one o'clock.
