



Mesa County Genealogical Society Cemetery History Project Est. 9/2022

- ✓ List all Mesa County Cemeteries, location, directions, entrance photos and provide on MCGS website (Karen Sturgill completed)
- ✓ Detailed history of each cemetery (Being updated/reviewed)
 - *By researching a cemetery, you learn about its history and character. The use of reliable sources and careful citations is essential to preparing the history of the cemetery. Consult primary sources, such as public records, newspaper accounts, meeting minutes, historical maps, and historical photographs.*
 - *Preserve distinguishing original qualities that reflect the integrity of the cemetery. Avoid removing or altering any historic material or distinctive landscape feature. Recognize that changes over time are evidence of the history and development of the cemetery. These changes may have acquired significance and this significance should be respected.*
 - *From Texas Historical Commission-Developing a Master Preservation Plan for a Historic Cemetery*
- ✓ Create a “committee” and identify agreed upon projects and develop Scope of Work
 - Define the project(s) to determine timeline (phased, one-time, or repetitive, i.e., annual event)
 - Put out calendar to entire MCGS group with dates/locations
 - Determine number of volunteers needed to achieve task *In this way, everyone associated with the project will know how long it will take, what the anticipated results of each phase will be and what the final product will accomplish.
 - Publicity
 - Determine if donations are needed for supplies
 - Contact civic groups, Boy/Girl Scouts, etc. to assist when needed
 - Can apply for grants for preservation of historic cemeteries

Potential Projects

- Survey some of the most historic gravestones and monuments within a cemetery which need repair.
 - Can contact local stone/monument businesses and funeral homes to see if they would volunteer to help restore
- On-site cemetery map (sections, lots, blocks, etc.) (Kiosk)
- On-site cemetery history (Kiosk)
- On-site alphabetical listing of all interred (Kiosk)
- Some type of marker signifying/honoring veterans (civil war, ww, etc.)
- Create and place markers for identifying rows/blocks, etc.
- Survey stones in need of cleaning or repair
 - Clean dirty/worn stones – safe products for dirt, rust, lime, calcium
- Photograph markers not currently on Find-a-Grave or BillionGraves

Cemeteries (Potential projects)

- Elmwood Cemetery – contacted. Waiting on Elmwood for direction.
- Ross Cemetery – contact current property owner/cdot/railroad for permission to place “Point of Interest” kiosk with Ross Cemetery history and list of those known to have been buried there
- Old Fairview (15th/G Rd) – “Point of Interest” kiosk with history
- Hope Cemetery (1st/Independent) – “Point of Interest” kiosk with history
- Crown Pointe

Possible assistance/Tips

- Involve the community (can contact local schools, homeschoolers, historical societies, etc. for assistance)
- Contact Find-a-Grave – can we get a list by location (lot block etc.) or get list from cemetery then walk cemetery to verify.
- Have a whiteboard to write individual information (name, birth, death, etc.) and take photo(s) if no marker present or marker illegible.
