Tribal Enrollment Process [Examples - Cherokee Nation]

Note: All Native American Tribes have different criteria for tribal enrollment. The membership requirements are set forth in the Tribal Constitution, Articles of Incorporation or Ordinances.

Common elements for enrollment include but are not limited to:

- Lineal dependency from someone named on the Tribal Base Roll, or relationship to a tribal member who descended from an individual named on the roll.
- Some tribes require: Tribal Blood Quantum, Tribal Residency, and 'Continued Contact' with the specific tribe.

This document gives an example of possible research and enrollment possibilities.

- 1) An individuals lineage must be reconstructed before any tribal enrollment process:
 - Trace ancestry from living individual to a tribal individual alive before 1850.
 - Primary sources must be used.
 - Most tribes require certified documents of birth, marriage, and death records.
 - Many tribes will not take photocopies, but require the certified documents with the enrollment application. (Which will be returned to you).
 - Adopted individuals require a certified birth certificate to establish your connection to the natural parent with tribal enrollment.
- Individuals looking at Tribal Enrollment connected to tribal benefits need to be aware that tribal benefits may not be connected to Tribal Enrollment.
 - Each tribe has criteria for benefits, which can include residency on tribal land.
 - Educational benefits for upper education (college) generally require, in addition to tribal enrollment, the understanding that the individual will apply for items such as Federal Pell Grants.
 - Tribes that offer tribal voting rights often have additional criteria.

- These were lists of individuals accepted between 1898 and 1914 by the Dawes Commission as members of the following tribes:
 - Cherokee, Creek, Choctaw, Chickasaw, and Seminole.
- Some individuals did not sign the Dawes Rolls for various reasons.

Note: There are several Cherokee tribes which include the Eastern Bank of Cherokees [https://ebci.com] and the Keetoowah Band in Oklahoma [www.keetoowahcherokee.org]

** Note: Cherokees who settled in Texas, Arkansas, Kansas, and Missouri were considered United States citizens and were <u>unable to enroll in the Cherokee Nation</u>. If you are a descendent from one of these individuals, you can not enroll even if heritage is proven.

Note on Blood Quantum as related to some tribal membership: This is just an example.

- Cherokee Eastern Band: Baker Roll of 1924, must be direct descendant with 1/16 Blood Quantum for membership.
- United Keetoowah Band: Blood Quantum of ¼ or higher.
